

## **Report**

### **Workshop on Pāli Language and Burmese Script**

The Pāli unit under the Department of Classical and Modern Languages, CIHTS has organised a *Workshop on Pāli language and Burmese Script* from March 02-07, 2020. There were six sessions on Burmese script along with two separate sessions—inaugural and valedictory.

All the six sessions were led by Dr Animesh Prakash, Assistant Professor in Pali, CIHTS. In the inaugural session the following guests were invited—
